# Mary Ann Shadd Cary 🏠




Mary Ann Camberton Shadd Cary, educator, publisher, abolitionist (born 9 October 1823 in Wilmington, Delaware. Mary Ann Shadd was the first Black female newspaper publisher in Canada. Shadd founded and edited *The Provincial Freeman*. She also established a racially integrated school for Black refugees in Windsor, Canada West. She played an important role in giving Black people a voice and advocating for women's rights. In 1994, Shadd was designated a Person of National Historic Significance in Canada.

On 9 October 2020, she was featured as a Google Doodle by Michelle Theodore for her 197th birthday. The Doodle honoured her legacy as the first Black female newspaper publisher in North America and for her advocacy for the abolition of slavery and for women's suffrage.
