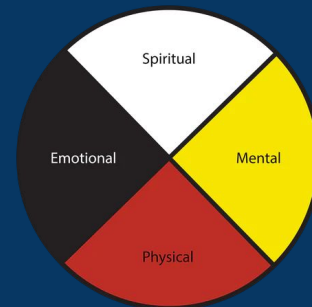

I refuse to participate in the problem.



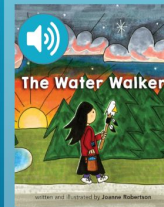
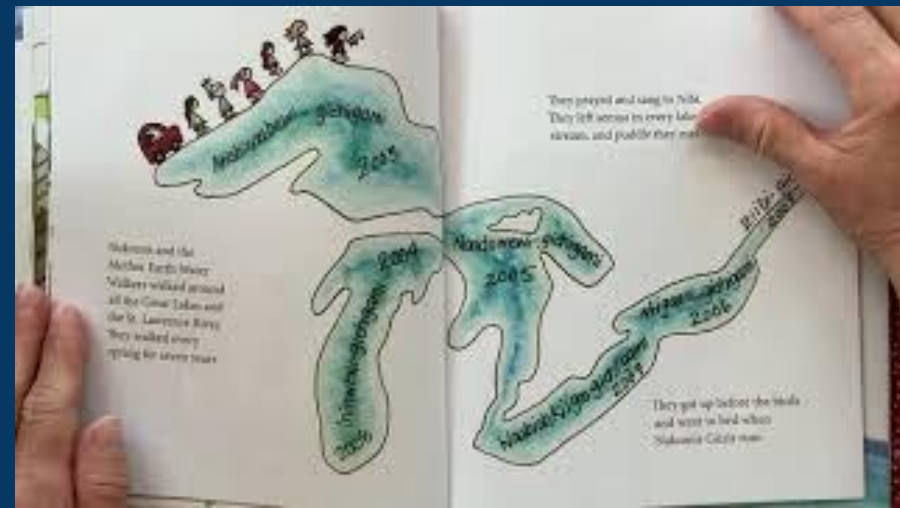
Literacy Learning

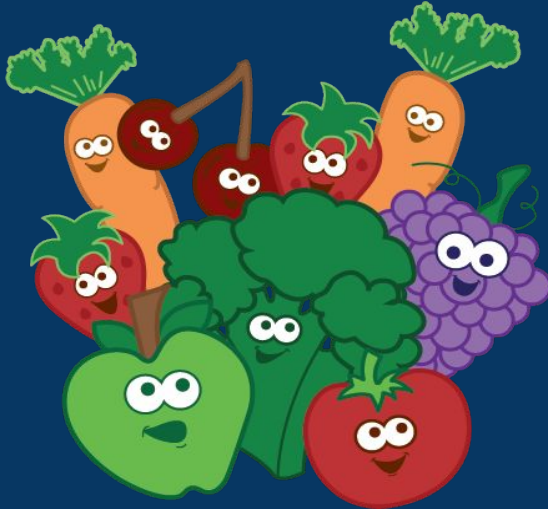

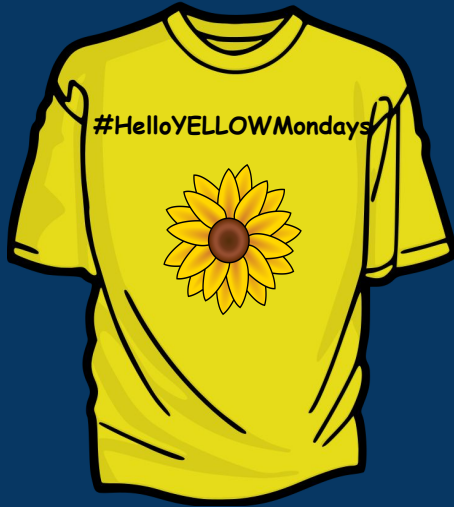
