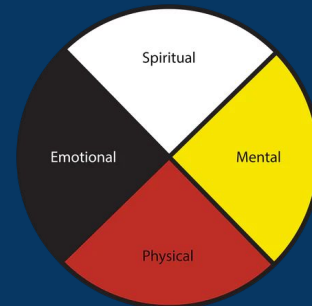

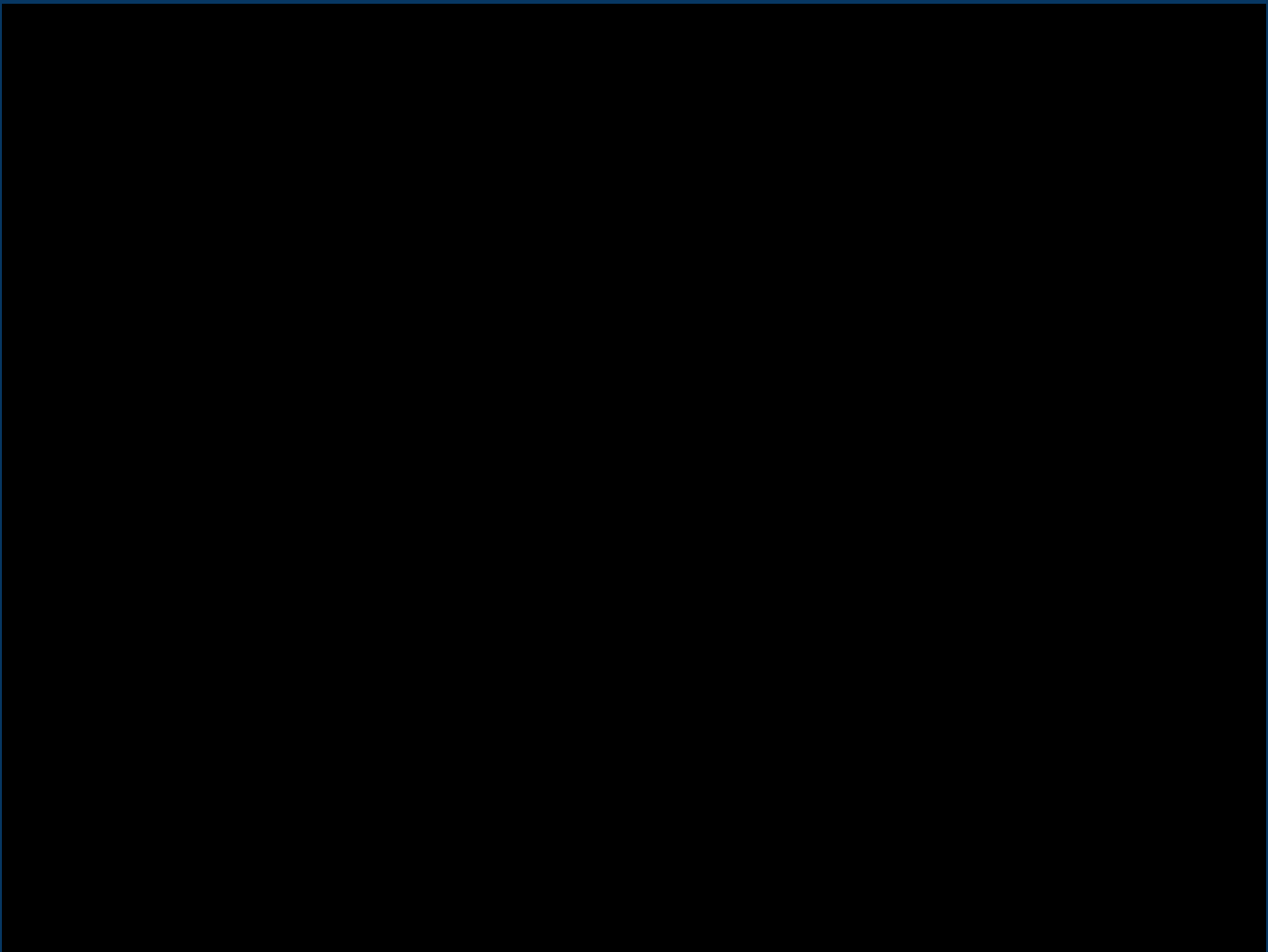
Tomorrow is Pizza Day!

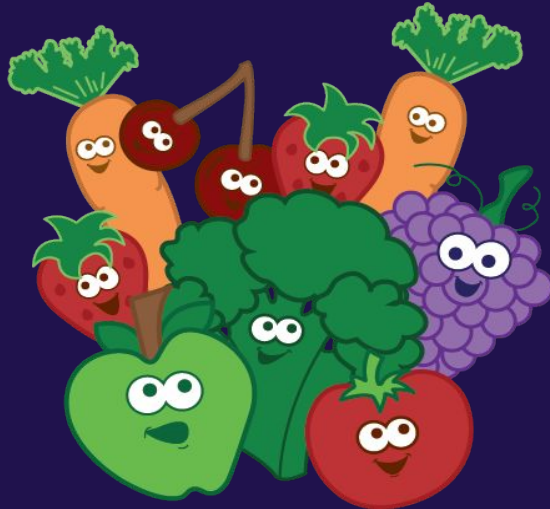
Bring your buckets down after 2nd break

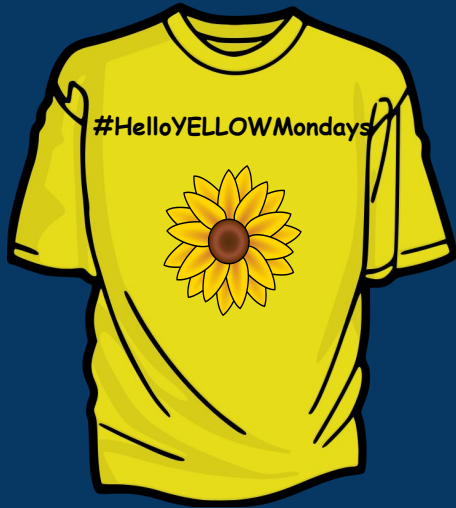
Clue 1: I am an actress and author.
