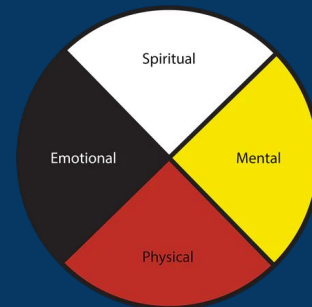

Today in our series entitled **SHARE THEIR STORY**, we introduce a Canadian civil rights activist and businesswoman who made a stand in what she believed in and thus cemented her place in Canadian history as she fought for racial equality. This is Viola Desmond...



Viola Desmond



Viola Desmond was designated a national historic person in 2017.

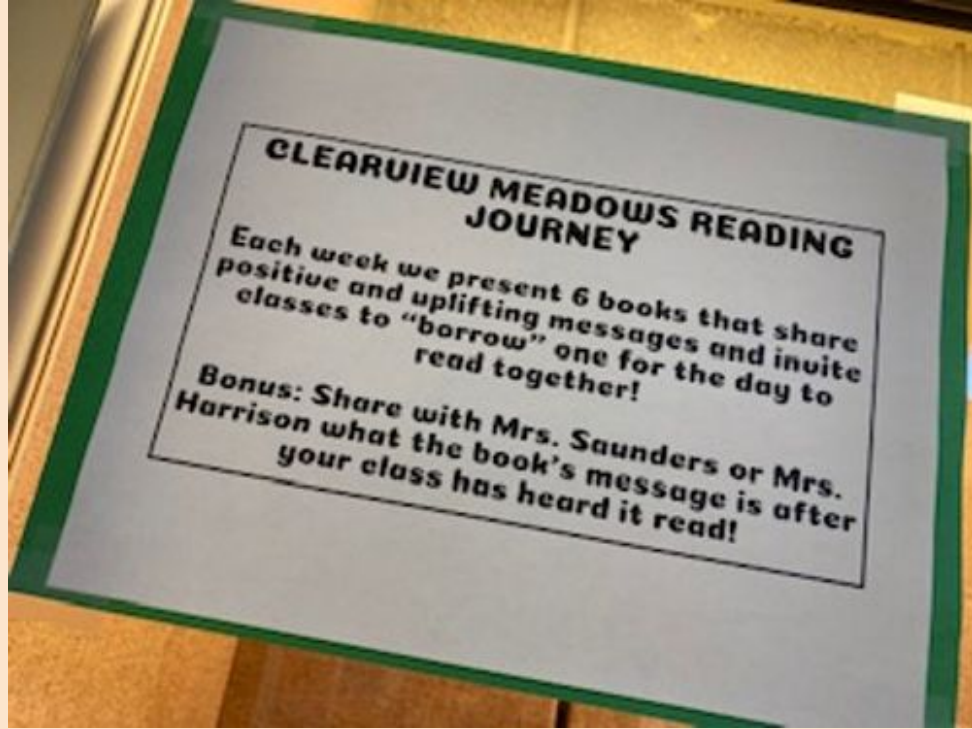
In 1946, Halifax businesswoman Viola Desmond confronted the racism that African-Nova Scotians routinely faced when she refused to move from her seat in the “whites-only” section of the Roseland Theatre, formerly located here. For this, she was arrested, jailed overnight, and fined. Her unsuccessful appeal to the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia attracted broad attention. It confirmed for African-Canadians that the law did not protect them and sparked their activism.

Desmond’s resistance to racial discrimination was an important milestone in Canada’s human rights history and an inspiration for the civil rights movement in this country.

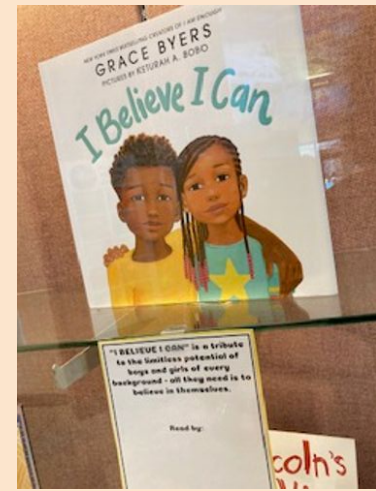




Pink, White and/or Red Day!

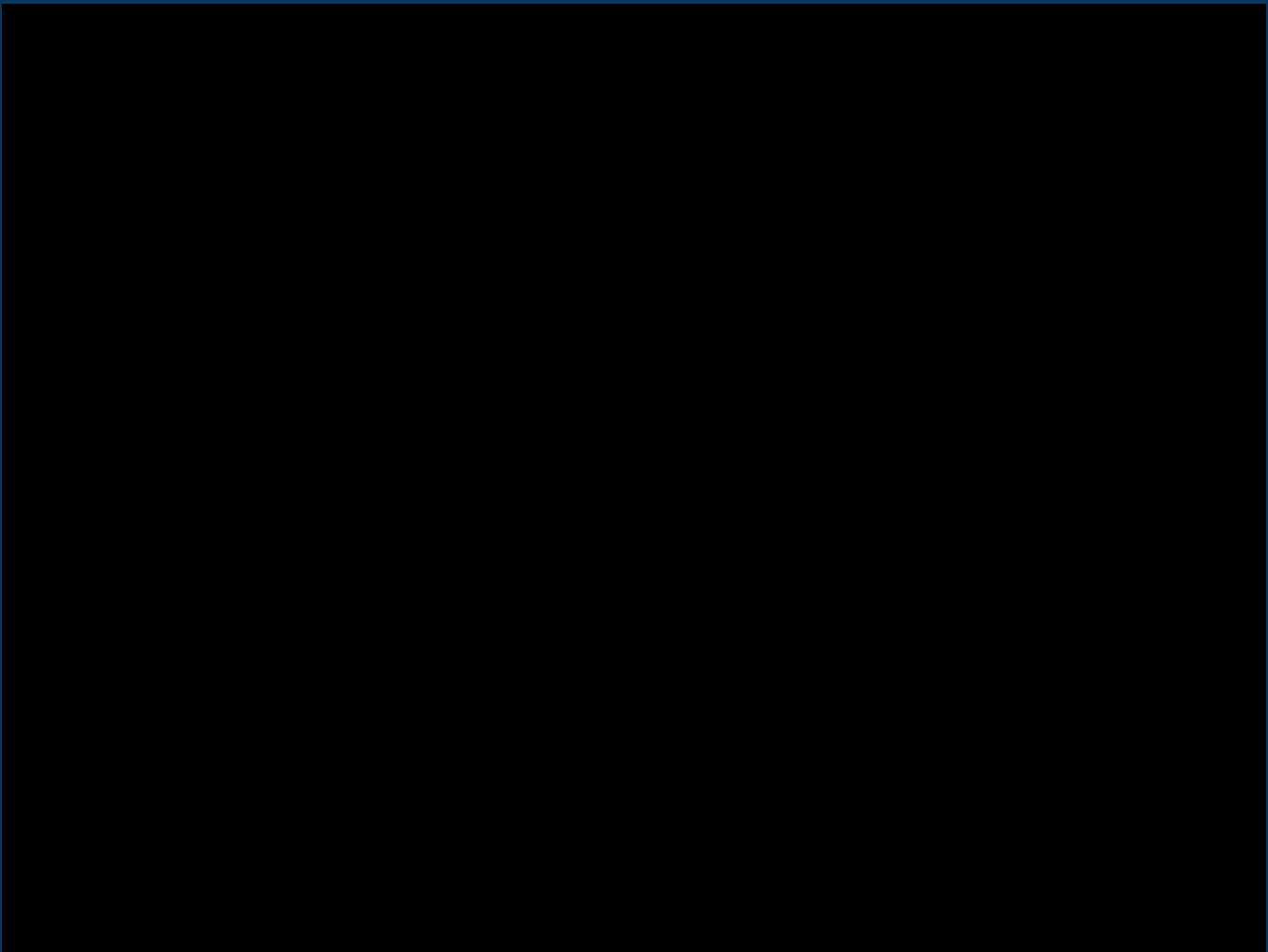

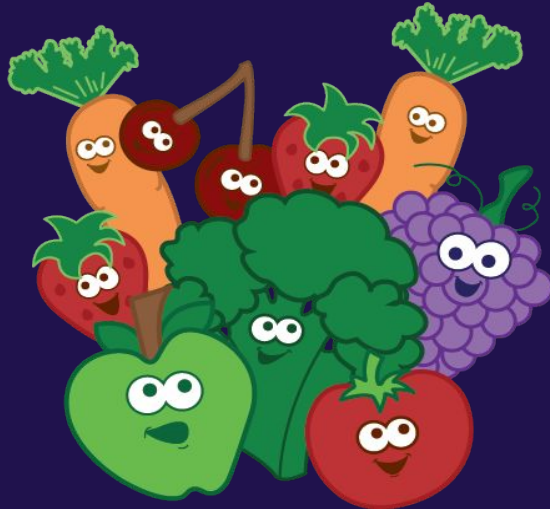
Bring your buckets down after 2nd break

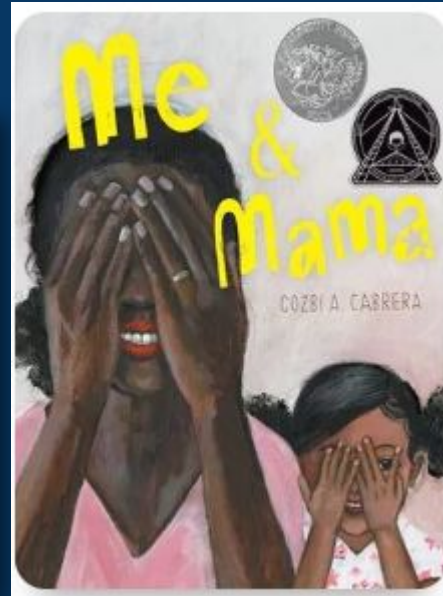
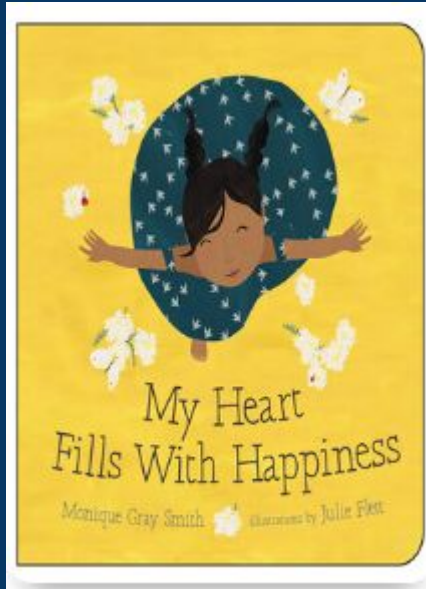


Until further notice...

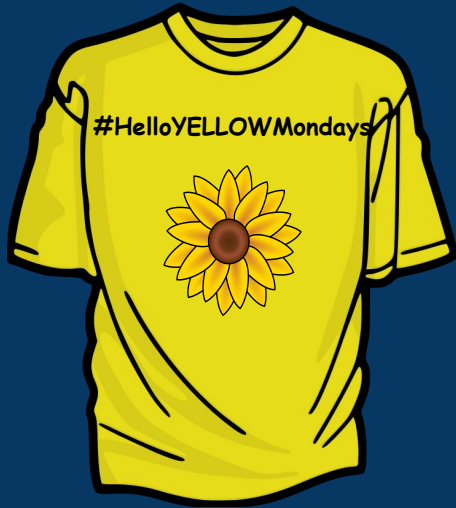
